## ACADEMIC PLANNING COMMITTEE (APC) ANNUAL REPORT TO THE UNL FACULTY SENATE

## Jennifer Clarke, Chair December 2023 – December 2024 Presented to the Faculty Senate on February 4, 2025

#### **Responsibilities:**

- A. Formulate and recommend to the Faculty Senate, to the Colleges, and to the Chancellor goals or UNL in the areas of education (resident and extension), research, and service.
- B. Recommend action to achieve the goals of UNL.
- C. Review with the Chancellor or appropriate Vice Chancellors the relevant campus physical planning documents as they relate to academic program needs and education research and service goals, and the Committee shall make recommendations.
- D. The Committee is empowered to approve or disapprove proposed new academic programs and changes in existing programs, including elimination.
- E. Concern itself with goals, needs, and resources for a future period as long as is prudent and reasonable in view of the information and advice available.
- F. Changes or elimination of existing programs shall include time and opportunity for existing personnel to qualify for a position in another program within the University whenever this requirement will not materially interfere with UNL achieving in full measure the goals of education, research, and service.
- G. Encourage academic planning within the colleges and other units of UNL on a continuing basis through joint faculty-administrative-student action.
- H. Assist the Chancellor in seeking remedies for financial exigency.

#### **Summary of Regular, Annual Activities:**

Academic Program Reviews (APRs)

# Summary of Activities (complete details can be found on the APC Minutes website <a href="https://apc.unl.edu/minutes/">https://apc.unl.edu/minutes/</a>):

- The APC discussed the Fall 2023 budget reduction process reviewing what worked well and what didn't work and discussed what activities the campus could undertake to mitigate the negative impacts of the budget reductions.
- The APC met with Chancellor Bennett on April 17, 2024, and he provided an update on the search for a new University President, discussed the hiring of the new Athletics Director, gave an update on the proposed stadium renovation, and reported that he was in the process of meeting with approximately 20 faculty members at each of the colleges. Chancellor Bennett noted that the campus will be facing another budget shortfall but pointed out that it would be inappropriate to initiate any reductions due to the transition of having a new system-wide President. The APC also discussed with the Chancellor the goal of getting readmitted to the AAU, the need for a system-wide strategic plan, and possible restructuring of the university.

- During the first APC meeting of the fall semester (September 11, 2024), APC Chair
  Jennifer Clarke provided an overview of the APC's responsibilities. The APC then
  discussed strategic planning and goals for the committee. The discussion on strategic
  planning continued at the following meetings. Prior to this meeting, APC Chair
  Clarke met with the Faculty Senate Executive Committee to encourage cooperation
  and communication between APC and Faculty Senate.
- Davis provided the APC with periodic updates on the budget reporting that the Chancellor was still in discussions with President Gold about the final budget numbers for UNL.
- The APC discussed the Business Simplified initiative which is set to examine whether UNL is using the most effective and efficient processes to do the work of the university. The discussion included lack of transparency with processes such as the hiring of faculty members which takes a lot of coordination and communication and the lack of information about the business centers' processes.
- Identified APC members to serve as the committee's representative on upcoming APRs: Earth & Atmospheric Sciences, Classics & Religious Studies, Child, Youth & Family Studies, University Libraries, Chemistry, School of Global Integrated Studies, Animal Science.

For each new program proposal two or three APC members volunteered to review the proposals and present their findings to the Committee. The programs listed below were reviewed and then approved.
